

Dental month! The American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA) sponsors National Pet Dental Health Month each February. Remember - dental health is very important, and poor dental health in pets can lead to other medical conditions. Keeping your cat or dog's teeth clean is an important preventative step in their overall wellbeing and care!

February 20th is national love your pet day! For most of us, that happens every day. Give your best friend an extra treat on the 20th to celebrate!

February 25th is international spay day! If you own a female dog or cat who is over six months old and not yet spayed, please give our office a call to discuss spay options. In case you didn't know, spaying your pet is a very important part of their health - unspayed female dogs and cats can develop a dangerous infection in their uterus called pyometra. Spaying your pet is the only way to prevent this infection by 100%.


